Currently, a total of 1,110,372 cases have been encountered and the total number of deaths is 34,752. Spanish media announced that the country's economy shrank by 17.8 per cent in April-July and continues to shrink. Spain announced that crowded areas such as museums, theatres, playgrounds were closed from March 11, all schools, including kindergartens and universities, are been closed. Even though the government applied strict curfew policies, COVID-19 cases have been spreading across the country. The government of Spain is still fighting against COVID-19. In 2012 there were 162,638 hospital beds in Spain, the largest number recorded during this period. We are trying to increase our bed and ICU units in the country.
