Therefore, it takes action and sets up some projects such as helping children have access to education and access to healthcare. The reduction of child mortality rate is also done with the contributions of the UK. In order to take action, international communities can monitor. There are communities such as the Afghanistan Independent Human Rights Commission or Afghan

human rights groups. The United Nations has also a great role in finding possible solutions.
