Atomic explosive weapons, radioactive weapons, lethal

chemical and biological weapons, and any weapons developed in the future which might have characteristics comparable in destructive effect to those of the atomic bomb or other weapons mentioned above.MDW constitutes a class of weaponry with the potential to produce in a single moment an enormous destructive effect capable to kill millions of civilians, cause death or serious injury of people through toxic or poisonous chemicals, disseminate disease-causing organisms or toxins to harm or kill humans, animals or plants or deliver nuclear explosive devices, chemical, biological or toxin agents to use them for hostile purposes or in armed conflict. Some WMDs have the capacity to remove a threat without disturbing the environment. Weapons of mass destruction prevent war from occurring

Long term risks may be severe and life threatening. Threat of unintended or accidental use, nuclear smuggling or terrorism, damage to life and environment from nuclear use reducing these effects depends on deploying effective detection systems to alert to WMD risks, establishing systems for rapid responses with facilities for decontamination and treatment of casualties, providing information to the affected population, and providing uncontaminated food, water, and environment after an attack.

About 'Preventing non-State actors from acquiring weapons of mass destruction" first resolution was adopted by the UN General Assembly in 1946 established a Commission to deal with problems related to the discovery of atomic energy among others. China has also signutered for Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons which were entered into force in 1970. China is also a member of NSG. The test demonstrated that certain non-weapons specific nuclear technology could be readily turned to weapons development. China has acceded to the Biological and Toxin Weapons Convention (BWC) in 1984 and ratified the Chemical Weapons Convention (CWC) in 1997

People's Republic of China has developed and possesses weapons of mass destruction, including chemical and nuclear weapons. China is currently a signatory of the Biological Weapons Convention and we have stated that China has engaged in The Treaty on the Non-Proliferation of Nuclear Weapons, commonly known as the Non-Proliferation Treaty or NPT, is an international

treaty whose objective is to prevent the spread of nuclear weapons and weapons technology biological activities with offensive military applications.

We as China state that we should be taking some restrictions for preventing non-State actors from acquiring weapons of mass destruction, by not crossing the line. We are hoping to find resolution to control and detect the non-state actors acquiring Atomic explosive weapons, radioactive weapons, lethal chemical and biological weapons.
