Topic: The Somalia Conflict: Implications for

peacemaking and peacekeeping efforts





Being a developed and economically good country, Brazil provides support for preventing conflicts and maintaining peace in Somalia. We think that bribery and chronic corruption have adversely affected the course of conflicts. These conflicts are one of the biggest obstacles to the construction of an effective army, and most of the money allocated for the army is transferred to other places, the soldiers cannot receive a salary, which causes the soldiers to leave the area they are responsible for due to their undisciplined behavior. In order to solve this problem, we provided additional financial support to the army and soldiers.

The current president stated that 300,000-400,000 people died due to conflicts since 1988. During this time, we ensured the safety of the local people living in Somalia, as well as the economy of the people deteriorated due to the conflicts and enough food could not be imported. As a result, famine began. In order to prevent famine, we provided imported food aid to Somalia and additional financial aid with the local people.

As the conflicts continue, we continue our efforts to migrate to places where the quality of life is high in order to increase the security of the local people in Somalia.
