Agenda Item: Preserving Human Rights of Uyghur Turks

The Uyghur Turks continue to suffer systematic violations of their fundamental human rights, including arbitrary detention, forced labor, forced sterilization, and suppression of religious freedom. Reports and evidence of mass surveillance, control measures, and forced assimilation policies further exacerbate their plight, leading to widespread condemnation and concern from the international community.

As the delegate of the Japan, we acknowledge the imperative to address the urgent human rights crisis facing the Uyghur Turks in the Xinjiang Uyghur Autonomous Region of China. As a nation committed to upholding human rights, Japan recognizes the gravity of the situation and the need for immediate action to ensure the protection and preservation of the rights and dignity of the Uyghur Turks.

Japan stands firmly in support of the Uyghur Turks and advocates for the following measures to address the human rights crisis:

- \* Independent Investigation: Japan calls for an independent and impartial investigation into the reported human rights abuses in Xinjiang. Such an investigation is crucial to establish accountability and ensure justice for the victims.
- \* Dialogue and Diplomacy: Japan emphasizes the importance of engaging in constructive dialogue with the Chinese government to address human rights concerns in Xinjiang. Diplomatic efforts must prioritize transparency, accountability, and respect for human rights obligations.
- \* Protection of Minority Rights: Japan underscores the need to protect the rights of Uyghur Turks, including their cultural identity, religious freedom, and fundamental human rights. Measures taken must be guided by the principles of non-discrimination, inclusivity, and respect for diversity.
- \* Support for International Mechanisms: Japan reaffirms its support for international mechanisms, including the United Nations, to monitor and address human rights violations effectively. Multilateral cooperation and collaboration are essential to ensure a comprehensive and coordinated response to the human rights crisis in Xinjiang.

Japan urges all member states to prioritize the preservation of human rights for the Uyghur Turks and take decisive action to address the crisis. We stand ready to work collaboratively with all stakeholders to ensure the protection and preservation of the rights and dignity of the Uyghur Turks.
