Ukraine which is the largest country in all of Europe with an area of 600,000 square kilometers is in Eastern Europe. Its capital is on Kiev. It frontiers Russia to the northeast and east, Belarus to the north, Poland and Slovakia to the west, And Hungary, Moldova and Romania to the southwest. It also has coasts to the Black Sea and Sea of Azov in the south. Ukraine's active population is 37 million.

Child labor is often seen as work that prevents children from experiencing their freedom, reduces their potential and dignity and mental development. Considered in its worst forms, child labor enslaves children, separates them from their families, exposes them to serious dangers and diseases and forces them to fend for themselves on the streets of big cities at a very young age.

- It depends on the duration and conditions of the work and the policies and attitudes in the country concerned.

UNICEF helps provide the care they need. It works to ensure that they live a safe life regardless of gender. Within the framework of the targets set for 2015, the United Nations determines priority issues for five-year periods and prepares a program on that subject. It is working with partners to reach vulnerable children and families with essential services – including health, education, protection, water and sanitation – as well as life-saving supplies.

The war in Ukraine is having a devastating impact on the country's 7.5 million children. Humanitarian needs are multiplying by the hour as the fighting continues. In 2022, Ukraine made minimal advancement in efforts to eliminate the worst forms of child labor. Despite the ongoing aggression and territorial incursions made by Russia against Ukraine, the Ukrainian government passed several pieces of legislation to address child.
