Russia, where officially known as the Russian Federation, is a country that stretches over a vast expanse of eastern Europe and northern Asia. There are about 120 ethnic groups in Russia who speak more than a hundred languages. Roughly 80 percent of Russians trace their ancestry to the Slavs who settled in the country 1,500 years ago. Other major groups include Tatars, who came with the Mongol invaders, and Ukrainians. Russian language, principal state cultural language of Russia. Together with Ukrainian and Belarusian, the Russian language makes up the eastern branch of Slavic family of languages. The capital city of Russia is Moscow.
