Introduction

The Russian Federation believes in strong protection for every child. Violence and bullying damage young peoples future and harm society. Russia is committed to work with international partners to keep children safe in all places.

Main Problems We See

Children in many parts of world face difficulties. In some regions, family violence or school bullying is big problem. Online bullying also grows because internet use increase. Some countries have weak laws, and children do not know where to find help. Russia believes solutions must respect national traditions and laws.

Russian Federation's View on This

We believe every state has right to choose its own way to protect children, based on national culture and legal system. Russia already has strong laws, such as Federal Law No. 436 on protecting children from harmful information, and policies against violence in schools. We support education in schools and families, stronger family values, and national programs for child safety. We also think international cooperation is good, but must respect sovereignty of each country.

Where Information Comes From

Information comes from Russian Ministry of Education, reports from child rights commissioners in Russian regions, and data from our national statistics office. We also review research from international organizations, but we focus on solutions that work in Russian context.

Suggestions for Action

Each country should develop its own laws against violence and bullying, without outside pressure.

Training for teachers and parents is important, using methods suited to local culture.

Support national child helplines and online platforms for reporting.

Technology companies should follow national laws and help make internet safer for children.

More exchange of best practices between countries, especially within frameworks like CIS and BRICS.

Conclusion

Russia is ready to cooperate to protect children worldwide, but solutions must respect different national approaches. We support practical steps and sharing experience, not one-size-fits-all models. Let's work together for children's safety, with respect for all nations.
