The Islamic Emirate of Afghanistan is a landlocked country located in South Asia. It borders Pakistan, Iran, Türkmenistan, Tajikistan, Uzbekistan and China. Afghanistan has a population of roughly 40 million people. The country has had many years of conflict, so technology and internet usage are not much. Many people use phones, but they don't really know how to use the internet safely. This makes Afghanistan vulnerable to cyber threats.

Cybersecurity provides protecting online information from hackers, fake news, and cybercrime. Countries need cybersecurity to keep people safe and protect banks, schools, hospitals, and governments. The United Nations talks about cybersecurity so countries can work together and stop cyber attacks.

Afghanistan has fewer resources and technology than many other countries. It made some laws against hacking and online crime, but it still has weak cybersecurity. Hackers and extremist groups sometimes target websites in the Middle East to spread false information or cause political tension. Therefore, regional cooperation is very important for cyber safety.

The United Nations should implement a Middle East Cybersecurity Program to teach Middle-Eastern countries how to be safe online and help to create a cybersecurity center with nearby countries. The UN should also help Middle Eastern countries get affordable antivirus software and safe digital tools. On top of that, the United Nations should make global rules to stop cyber attacks and make donation websites more secure. And I also think that funding can come from the United Nations, as well as from helpful countries such as Turkey and Qatar, and different big tech companies that support cybersecurity in developing regions.
