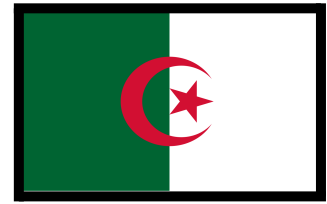


**Committee:** United Nations Security Council

**Topic:** The situation in Central African Republic

The Central African Republic has experienced decades of instability due to weak governance and proliferation of independent armed groups. Despite peacekeeping efforts such as the establishment of MINUSCA, the CAR still faces significant concerns including humanitarian crises and civilian displacements. Foreign involvement has also highly complicated the situation, and sometimes even deepened the conflict. Taking all the insufficiencies of alternative healing methods used until now into consideration and finding the problems causing them not to work will be Algerian delegation's main objective while working in order to suggest the best possible solutions.

Considering the current conflicts and political confusions in the Central African Republic, UNSC will be playing a crucial role for the solution. The delegation of Algeria is ready for taking immediate action, and since we respect all nations' state sovereignties and independencies, we will be delighted to lead the actions that will be taken to satisfy the best possible conditions for all African nations. As an ineradicable member of the African Union, we are proposing the idea of creating the African-led infrastructure that promises permanent welfare in CAR as soon as possible.

Algeria has consistently supported African-led peace initiatives and multilateral diplomatic frameworks, particularly under the African Union and UN umbrella. While not directly involved in CAR, Algeria has participated in AU Peace and Security Council discussions concerning the region and supports continental stability through regional dialogue and preventive diplomacy.

As a nation with a history of liberation from colonial domination, Algeria sympathizes with the concerns that African nations are entangled in post-colonial instability. In order to initiate the permanent peacekeeping action, Algeria believes that the sustainability can only be achieved by an approach centered on:

Inclusive national dialogue (Bringing together government representatives, opposition figures, civil society, and tribal leaders under a neutral platform such as an AU–UN co-facilitated summit.),

Humanitarian access and civilian protection (Establishing UN-monitored humanitarian corridors in conflict-heavy zones to protect aid delivery and civilians.),

Limiting foreign militarization ( Encouraging international stakeholders to refrain from unilateral interventions and instead work under multilateral mandates that respect CAR's sovereignty.).

To conclude, Algeria stands ready for collaboration and cooperation with other UNSC member states on the vision of creating the human-centered and peace driven resolution that the people of CAR deserves. Peace in the Central African Republic is not only possible, but also necessary.
