As the delegation of France, we are honored to bring this position paper on the Russia-Ukraine war to the attention of the Disarmament and International Security Committee (DISEC).

We would like to share with you some of the issues that our country has addressed in this regard.

1) Our View Of The Situation In General:

We regard the Russian-Ukrainian crisis as a serious threat and we are in favour of a peaceful solution to this threat. We recognize that this crisis is a threat to the security and stability of the region.

2) Commitment to International Law and Diplomacy:

We condemn Russia's annexation of Crimea and its influence in eastern Ukraine, which means that we emphasize the sovereignty of Ukraine and the protection of international law by the United Nations and other countries, and the importance of the diplomatic part in resolving the conflict.

3) Sanks and Diplomatic Repression:

We support effective diplomatic pressure and international sanctions against Russia, but we believe that such pressure and sanctions should not adversely affect civilians.

4) Our Collaborations:

We support joint efforts with a number of international organizations to resolve the crisis, and we are working with Russia and Ukraine's neighbors to find a solution to the crisis.

5) Humane Aid:

We support the delivery of humanitarian assistance to minimize the humanitarian impact of this crisis, and we stand ready to do all we can to ensure the safety of civilians. In particular, we want to ensure the needs and safety of civilians migrating from Ukraine to other countries, and we ask other countries to do the same.

These are some of the issues we are addressing.

As a result, we are on the side of Ukraine in this war because we are a member of NATO and especially because of the atrocities committed by Russia, and we hope that the war will end before the effects of this war grow further.
