

Topic: The Escalating Conflict and Humanitarian Crisis In Sudan



Somalia, officially known as the Federal Republic of Somalia, is the easternmost country in continental Africa. Somalia has the longest coastline on Africa's mainland and has an estimated population of more than 18 million. Nearly 3 million of the population lives in the capital and the largest city, Mogadishu. As one of Africa's most ethnically homogenous countries, around 85% of the population is ethnic Somalis. The official language is Somali but as well Arabic, is recognized as the country's second language. Most of the population is known as sunni muslim.

Somalia is aware of what is happening in Sudan. The situation is no longer only a political or military crisis. Civilians are in danger, which means human rights are getting ignored. The indiscriminate use of violence, sexual and gender based abuses are serious violations that must not remain unanswered. We call upon all sides to immediately cease hostilities, ensure full safe, unhindered humanitarian access.
