Germany is located in the heart of Europe. On world maps, you can usually see Germany in a place surrounded by neighboring countries in the middle. In the north of Germany are the North and Baltic Seas, and in the south there are the Alps.

Germany is the most populous country in the European Union. country population is 80.722.792. Germany with an average growth of 1.6 a year which has a nominal GDP of 3,951,340 trillion dollars, ranks 4th behind Japan in the list of largest economies.

According to the rules, it has been announced that the restriction will take two weeks in the first place and the distance between people will be less than one and a half meters in public places. More than two people who were not living in the same house or were together for work were prohibited from gathering outdoors. On the other hand, it was announced that while it is possible to go to the doctor, shopping or work, in all states, restaurants can only serve take-away and hairdressers, beauty centers and massage parlors will not serve. In addition, it was stated that these new decisions were aimed at slowing the spread of coronavirus. Nowadays, with the increase of the cases, it is 1 million 289 thousand below the cases in Africa with 431 thousand cases. Merkel attributes the fact that these cases cannot be prevented these days, in order to keep the economy alive again after 6 months, the opening of schools as well as eating places.

The German government can provide people in Africa with a large number of items such as test kits, masks, respirators, protective clothing. Specialist personnel and equipment can be sent to Africa. The 3 million dollars required for the prevention of coronavirus in Africa should be shared on good economies, and other countries need to supply Africa from personnel cleaning and hygiene kits as well as medicines used for treatment.
