

Topic: The situation in Central African Republic

Country: Kingdom of Denmark

The Central African Republic has been experiencing instability since its independence in 1960 due to weak governance and the rapid increase of independent armed groups. Despite peacekeeping efforts, notably MINUSCA, CAR continues to face problems such as human rights violations, civilian displacements and ongoing regional armed conflicts. To stop the armed conflicts between armed groups and the government, the government and the groups tried to sign a peace treaty multiple times but none of the peace treaties had resulted in lasting peace and both of them only lasted for small periods.

The Kingdom of Denmark remains committed to promoting peace, stability and humanitarian assistance in the Central African Republic. Although Denmark has no bilateral relations with CAR, it contributes to CAR by multiple frameworks, particularly as part of the United Nations Security Council. Denmark provides funding to UN agencies that operate in the Central African Republic and supports International Crime Court investigations into war crimes in ongoing conflicts. Furthermore, Denmark aligns with the European Union imposing sanctions on Wagner Group, whose presence has been linked to several armed conflicts and human rights abuses in CAR. Denmark calls for international cooperation to uphold human rights and lead to an increase at stability in the region.

As an upholder of peace and human rights and a member of the UNSC, Denmark believes that sustainability in the region can only be achieved by an approach that centers around:

Humanitarian aid and access (Establishing UN-controlled safe zones in heavy-conflict zones in CAR to deliver aid and provide protection to civilians that suffer from the heavy-conflict zones)

Security and disarmament (Enforcing an arms embargo on the armed groups that are active in the Central African Republic to reduce the armed conflicts bilaterally by not giving the groups weapons and increasing surveillance on trafficking routes from neighbouring countries)

Countering foreign interference (Imposing targeted sanctions on stakeholders that intervein on CAR's sovereignty for illogical reasons)

To conclude, Denmark stands ready to work with all the members in this council to create a resolution that provides humanitarian relief and lasting stability, which is centred around peace that CAR people merit. Not only CAR, but peace is what every nation deserves, and exceptions cannot be made.
