Ministerial Statement

To the President of the Government of Spain,

Ministry of Foreign Affairs:

For the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, we are on believe keeping NATO united is the most important thing. And againly we believe strongly that the crisis in Kosovo when we focus on political dialogue and negotiations can only be solved be safely. Thats why we think we need to work together with other international groups.

Spain also thinks it is very important to help the region recover after the conflict. This means building strong institutions and supporting democracy to stop any future trouble. Respecting international laws and human rights is still a most important for us.

Ministry of Defence:

The Ministry of Defence supports Spain joining NATO operations, but only when it is necessary and agreed on by the Alliance. We see military action as a last option. If used, it must be limited and controlled carefully.

Spain wants to highlight that protecting civilians is essential. Also, keeping the area safe after the conflict ends should be a goal of NATO

Ministry of the Interior:

The Ministry of the Interior focuses on humanitarian aid and being prepared in Spain. Spain is ready to give aid and help refugees if needed. We will work with NATO allies and other partners. Keeping public order and social stability is very important during this crisis. Overall In general, Spain supports a NATO approach that is well-coordinated. We need to balance security measures with long-term political solutions. Spain will always supports peace and stability in Europe for world. And we want to say always again we will keep working with our allies to find a real safe solution in Kosovo.
