Ethiopia ratified most of the international instruments on human rights and women's rights. The 1995 Ethiopian Constitution contains the principle of equality generally and women's rights specifically. Since the Ethiopian Constitution is the supreme law of the land, any law and government decision contradicting with the constitutional principles of gender equality and women's rights shall be of no effect.

The protection of women's rights in a country, men and women in the constitution should not be limited to provisions that declare women to be equal. National laws and policies in different fields also promote gender equality. should provide. Accordingly, the equality of men and women in the Constitution in Ethiopia. There are laws that implement the principle.

In our opinion, this problem in the global scale can be solved by introducing a specific law regarding mobbing in all countries, ensuring that the persons concerned are punished, and making the equality of men and women more obvious and not making a difference between the genders, UN WOMEN also aims to do this.
