Mexico is having many problems with so much crimes, drug cartels and justice. In Mexico, police, prosecutors, the military, and criminal groups regularly commit serious and widespread human rights violations, including arbitrary detention, torture, extrajudicial killings, enforced disappearances, abuses against migrants, and attacks on journalists and human rights defenders. Mexican security forces commit unlawful killings of civilians at an alarmingly high rate and widely use torture including beatings, waterboarding, electric shocks, and sexual abuse as a tool to gain information from detained victims.

People who tend to leave Mexico for the U.S. are from lower-class backgrounds. Mexicans account for the biggest group of immigrants living in America. Mexico has the 11th to 13th richest economy in the world and ranks 4th with most number of poor among richest economies. Mexico is the 10th to 13th country with the most number of poor in the world. But the main reason for migration to U.S. is economic inequality, rural poverty, significantly lower wages, and better opportunities.

To fix this problem in police a solid police infrastructure must be established and policemen who use violence against civilians and assist criminals should be punished. To create a better police, help can be sought from other countries and a certain amount of money can be given in return for the requested assistance. There are specific economic factors that contribute to immigration, including the desire to obtain higher wage rates, improve the standard of living, have better job opportunities, and gain an education. better education opportunities can be provided in Mexico to solve this problem. The main problem of poverty is that the poor are not helped, even those who are better off before the poor. For this, a non-governmental organization can be formed by bringing together people who are against this situation in the country, and by getting help from the state, job opportunities can be provided to the poor, and perhaps even some money can be given, thereby reducing migration due to poverty.
