

Italy has always been an active member of the United Nations Security Council whenever it has been a present member, and it continues to provide unwavering support for its mission of maintaining international peace and security to this day. Italy emphasizes the importance of civilian security and having a common ground in international waters and lands. The Cyprus problem has special importance for Italy as it has a border with the Medetarian Sea.

Italy would act in concert with any solution idea that is consistent with our ultimate goal, international peace.
