The Islamic Republic of Iran is home to the largest and most long-term stays due to their situation, and taking shelter in a year-round holiday camps. Forty years since the Soviet invasions of 1979 and the ensuing Afghanistan, it remains the longest-term contract UNHCR has ever held. About five million Afghans have been used abroad; 90% is hosted by the Islamic Republics of Pakistan and Iran.

In Iran, the government's progressive and inclusive policies have given refugees access to education, health and livelihood opportunities – helping them not only survive but thrive. It is estimated that 96% of refugees in Iran live in cities, towns and villages alongside the Iranian host community, 4% live in 20 settlements managed by UNHCR's main government counterpart, the Office of Aliens and Foreign Migration Affairs (BAFIA).
